Nashua Senior Activity Center Membership Updates:

Membership Fees: The Board of Directors approved a change in the membership fee which will be effective January 1, 2016 - January 1, 2018. The rate for <u>new</u> members will be forty dollars (\$40) per year for an individual member and sixty dollars (\$60) per year for two individuals residing at the same address. A discount of five dollars (\$5) will continue to be offered to eligible veterans. Seniors ninety years of age and older will continue have the membership fee waived.

The membership fee for all <u>current</u> members in good standing will remain the same: thirty five dollars per year for an individual and fifty dollars per year for two individuals residing at the same address. If a current membership lapses, a sixty-day grace period for renewal will be granted. If a member does not renew within the sixty day grace period, the membership fee increase will be applied.

The membership fee includes: discounts on programs and classes, free special events including educational seminars, workshops and social events, eligibility for fitness center membership, use of member lounge with computers, and resource library with internet access, thrift shop deals and discounts, and other services.

Membership Cards: Thanks to a very generous donation from an anonymous supporter, we have an updated software system to process memberships as well as a new membership card system that allows us to issue photo ID cards. The new cards will be issued as membership renewals are due.






