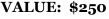

Get your taxes done (virtually) for FREE by VITA volunteers & United Way of Greater Nashua

Due to COVID-19, AARP TaxAide will not be open at the Nashua Public Library, Nashua Senior Center, Hudson Library, and Hudson Senior Center this tax season. Free income tax preparation services for individuals

whose income is \$57,000 or less, and located in the Nashua and Hudson communities will be available by appointment only though VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) using IRS-certified volunteers. All tax returns will be prepared virtually. There will be no in-person contact between taxpayers and volunteers.
